Art Stage Singapore 2012

Under the guidance of new Director Lorenzo Rudolf, Art Stage Singapore 2012 has launched Singapore into the international art scene. The second edition of Art Stage Singapore (ArtSS12) took place in January of this year at the Marina Bay Sands Convention and Exhibition Centre welcoming collectors and taste makers to Singapore, Asia's new art hub. Collectors such as Indonesia's Deddy Kusuma and Oei Hong Djien, Korea's Kim Chang-il and Hong Kong's Agnes Lin in addition to block buster artists Takashi Murakami and Yoshitomo Nara also attended.

The 2012 edition saw a continued commitment to quality artwork through the stringent selection process for participating galleries. Collectors, artists, curators, galleries and art aficionados alike all enjoyed a dynamic exchange of dialogue and ideas.

Lorenzo Rudolf who was behind the success of the first Art Basel in the 1990s and later Shanghai's ShContemporary has had a tremendous impact on the success of the fair this year. On the opening of the preview night he said, "In five to six years, Art Stage Singapore will be one of the top shows in the world."
